Business owners are responsible for ensuring that any contractor they hire is properly trained, certified, and compliant with NFPA 96. Contractors not listed may also be acceptable if they hold current, verifiable credentials and are registered through the City's Citizenserve portal.

What to Look for When Choosing a Qualified Hood Cleaning Contractor

When choosing a hood cleaning company, verify that the contractor and all technicians hold current certifications demonstrating compliance with NFPA 96. Acceptable credentials include those from the International Kitchen Exhaust Cleaning Association (IKECA) or the Power Washers of North America (PWNA). Equivalent certifications from other recognized organizations may also be accepted with approval from the Fire Code Official.

What to Expect from a Qualified Hood Cleaning Contractor

Following each service, the contractor should provide the business owner with:

- 1. A Cleaning Certificate or Service Tag Affixed near the hood or main duct access panel, showing the date of cleaning, technician name, company contact information, and next scheduled cleaning date.
- 2. A Written Cleaning Report A detailed report outlining the work performed, including:

- System identification (hoods, ducts, and fans serviced)
- o Date and time of cleaning
- Names of technicians
- Methods used (manual, chemical, or pressure cleaning)
- o Pre- and post-cleaning photographs
- o Areas not cleaned or requiring repair

- List of any deficiencies or hazards observed
- Signatures of both the technician and the owner's representative
- A statement indicating compliance with NFPA 96 (2021 Edition, Chapter 11)
