The March 4th First Friday booth, a joint operation by FNI and the City of Bryan yielded substantial public input and generated significant attention for Blueprint 2040. First Friday is a widely attended downtown community event for residents throughout Bryan-College Station. This booth was important because it reached a wider range of the public than those that usually attend public meetings.

At the booth were three interactive boards. The first asked residents “What Amenities are Needed in Bryan’s Parks?”; the second asked “What is the Greatest Issue Facing Bryan?”; the third asked residents to describe their vision for Bryan. Also at the booth was a six question survey designed to be capable of filling out in under a minute. FNI also provided literature about the Blueprint 2040 process and links to the project’s social media and website accounts.

Participants were given three votes and asked to select the top amenities needed in local parks from a list of 18 choices. The top 5 selections, which collected over half of the 600 responses were:

1. Non-motorized trails (91)
2. Open space/nature (78)
3. Dog parks (64)
4. Splash pads (36)
5. Additional parks (35)

Other noteworthy results included community center/natatorium (34) and inclusive playgrounds (33). Within the “other” category, written comments that attracted support included arboretums and botanical gardens, community gardens, restrooms within parks, educational and meditative space, and indoor recreation.

Participants were then given three more votes and asked to identify the three greatest issues facing the City from a broad list of 9. The top three selections, taking over half of the 155 votes were:

- School system perception (36*)
- Congestion or connectivity (25)
- Neighborhoods (22)

**concern over perceived inability to attract and retain teachers was a recurring comment from participants*


Appearance or perception and growth, zoning, and land use were the next two largest categories at 20 and 19 votes each.

We also asked for an open-ended vision for Bryan, residents expectedly provided a range of responses though the overall themes were consistent with previous feedback:


1. Improved connectivity and transportation (sidewalks, thoroughfares, bike lanes/trails, and public transit) (10)
2. Amenities (retail, restaurants, nightlife, and family venues) (9)
3. Aesthetics, beatification, and sense of place (8)


It should be noted that though curbside recycling did not fit into any specific category, it was mentioned over a dozen times between the three boards.

60-Second Survey

A 60-second survey was also available during the meetings to quickly gain snapshot information about people who were participating in Blueprint 2040. This survey was a precursor to the version provided online. These surveys were completed over the course of several meetings.

During the first First Friday meeting (of the hundreds of citizens that FNI interacted with), a handful (13) elected to take the brief survey.

- 69% of respondents both live and work in Bryan
- 54% of respondents have lived in Bryan for 10 or more years; 46% have lived in Bryan for less than five years
- 85% of respondents stated that the City has a responsibility to actively participate, including financially, in corridor revitalization efforts
- 38% of respondents indicated that they find Bryan to be an attractive City in terms of appearance; 31% were neutral; 15% found Bryan to be unattractive or very unattractive
- 92% of respondents stated that the look and appearance of Bryan is either important or very important
- 77% of respondents stated that the City should raise its development standards even if it makes development more costly; the remaining respondents were unsure
- In the comments section, respondents listed concern regarding pedestrian and bicyclist safety, desire for public transit, frustration with train noise, and displeasure with the appearance of corridors



Q1 Which best describes you?











Q6 Do you have children of 18 years of age or younger at home? If YES, in which of the following age groups do they belong?



Q7 What general area of Bryan do you live in?



Q8 How would you rate Bryan in terms of general appearance?







Q20 Does the City have sufficient parks and open space facilities to meet the future needs of the community?














